It is the policy of the State Board for Technical and Comprehensive Education (SBTCE) that eligible employees may participate in political activity including running for federal, state, county, local or other office so long as no government personnel, equipment, or materials are used, and the employees' job responsibilities do not suffer. Eligible employees include all employees of the SBTCE and its sixteen colleges, with the exception of those funded either in whole or in part by federal funds. Employees who opt to participate in political activity must do so on their own time and on non-government premises.
